Our fundamental objective is to decrease the racial wealth gap, using entrepreneurship as an engine.

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REALITY

MARKET ACCESS

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Minority-owned businesses encounter barriers in accessing new markets or securing contracts with large corporations or government entities, due to lack of information, resources, or perceived biases

NETWORKING OPPORTUNITIES

Building a robust network is crucial for business growth. However, minority entrepreneurs often face difficulties in accessing and integrating into wellestablished business networks

UNDERREPRESENTATION

There are 211,524 Minority-Owned businesses in the state of Arizona



ABILITY TO SCALE & GROW

There is often a gap in crucial business knowledge and management skills essential for scaling and growing a business

ACCESS TO CAPITAL

Black and Hispanic entrepreneurs face challenges in accessing capital and are more likely to start businesses with less than \$10,000 in capital, leading to lower sales, profits, and survival rates

DISPARITY

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Minority-Owned businesses create fewer jobs on average compared to all businesses. A significant number are sole proprietorships

Arizona Small Business

According to the Small Business Association in 2019, Arizona had 650,151 small businesses, which represented 99.5% of all businesses in the state. The Table below represents the business count by owner demographic group.
